Originally hailing from the cornfields of Northwestern Illinois, Shelby Gahm is an American writer and artist interested in all things mystery, folklore, and myth.


As an art teacher, Gahm is usually covered in glitter and Elmer's glue. Fair Game is her debut into the world of writing and fan fiction.
